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Reading Specialist

What is Title 1?

- A Federal Assistance Program that provides monetary support to America's public schools.
- ✓ **Reading Support** is small group or one-on-one in the classroom or a reading specialist's room. Reading support is provided during *Guided Reading and Excel*
- ✓ **Math Support** is primarily provided in the classroom. Aides work with students in small groups or one-on-one.
- ✓ Student Progress is closely monitored and changes are made to teaching groups as needed

How Do Students Qualify for Title 1?

- Student Data, performance on District and State Assessments and Individual student need is considered when identifying students for Title 1 reading and/or math support.
- Student proficiency levels are closely monitored and students are added or exited from Title 1 when needed.

What Assessments are used to Monitor Student Progress?

- Sight Word Inventories
 - Running Records
 - MAPS Tests (NEW)
- Oral Reading Fluency
 - Wonders Unit Tests
- Everyday Math Unit Tests
 - Progress Monitoring

What is the Goal of Title 1?

Title 1 strives to support students in achieving and maintaining PROFICIENT scores on district and state assessments and common core standards.
